What is a 'Baby'?

A Baby is a small parasitic mammal, approximately 6 to 24 pounds in weight, measuring between 1 to 2.5 feet in length.

They are notable for their flailing limbs and loud screeching calls. Although their small size and apparent helplessness can engender feelings of sympathy, Babies should always be treated with suspicion.

Where do Babies come from?

How do they operate?

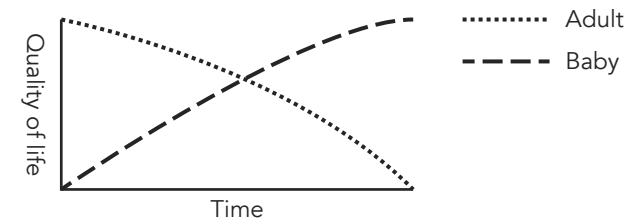
Despite their small size and physical fragility, Babies are masterful psychological operatives.
